PARTNERSHIPS AND DONATIONS BENEFITTING STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

City of Los Angeles Partnership Helps Fund Counselors in 14 YouthSource Centers and 3 America’s Job Centers of CA Amount **\$6.4M**

- Seeking approval of \$6,440,110 revenue contract from the City of Los Angeles to partially fund 19 Los Angeles Unified counseling related positions in 14 YouthSource Centers and three America’s Job Centers of California.
- Counselors provide on-site support and educational services to students 16-24 years old from highest need communities.
- Since 2012, the YouthSource City Partnership Program has provided over 36,000 youth with an educational and psychosocial assessment.
- Since 2014, over 4,200 students who had previously dropped out of school were re-enrolled.



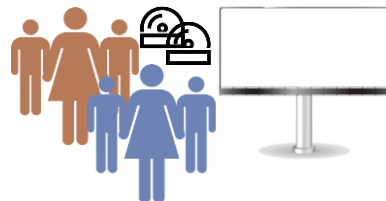
City of Los Angeles Partnership Helps Fund Counselors in 16 FamilySource Centers throughout Los Angeles **\$6.5M**

- Seeking approval of \$6,500,000 revenue contract from the City of Los Angeles to partially fund 18 Los Angeles Unified counseling related positions in 16 FamilySource Centers across Los Angeles.
- Counselors provide parents and students with academic consultation and resources to address academic barriers.
- Established in 2014, the FamilySource City Partnership Program is a collaborative effort between Los Angeles Unified and the City of Los Angeles Housing and Community Department.



Donations Support Schools **\$79K**

- Seeking approval to accept \$79,357 in donations to schools to provide general supplies, equipment, teacher assistants, and a new marquee. The list of donors include:

Reseda Charter High School Comprehensive Modernization Project (BD6, LD Northwest) \$171M

- Project will provide safe and updated school facilities to support 21st century learning
- Total investment anticipated: \$171,024,705
- Today’s action: Adoption of Mitigated Negative Declaration and Project Approval.
- New facilities to be constructed include 15 classrooms, instructional support spaces, support areas, multipurpose/performing arts building, an administration building, cafeteria/lunch shelter/student store, library, and covered walkways.
- Main Gym and Practice Gym will be seismically retrofitted and modernized.
- At least 3,200 full-time equivalent construction related jobs anticipated to be generated.

Belvedere Middle School Comprehensive Modernization Project (BD2, LD East) \$159M

- Project will provide safe and updated school facilities to support 21st century learning.
- Total investment anticipated: \$159,343,020
- Today’s action: Adoption of Mitigated Negative Declaration and Project Approval.
- New facilities to be constructed include 23 classrooms, instructional support spaces, textbook room, support areas, administration, gymnasium, maintenance and operations, food service and lunch shelter.
- The Classroom and Library Building and the Auditorium, which is a portion of the Main Administrative Building, will be seismically retrofitted and modernized.
- At least 2,900 full-time equivalent construction related jobs anticipated to be generated.

Marvin Elementary Critical School Repairs (BD1, LD West)

\$10.1M

- Seeking approval of \$10,142,391 project to provide approximately 100,000 square feet of new asphalt paving at the main playground, kindergarten playground and parking area.
- Includes greening areas, a reading garden, along with path of travel and accessibility upgrades.
- Project anticipated to be completed in 2022.

Saturn Street Elementary Critical School Repairs (BD1, LD West)

\$6.4M

- Seeking approval of \$6,441,875 project to provide approximately 73,500 square feet of new asphalt paving campus-wide, including greening areas and a new parking area.
- Includes accessibility upgrades to the boys' and girls' restrooms.
- Project anticipated to be completed in 2022.
