# Expanded Learning Opportunity Grant Overview

- LA Unified will receive \$400.8M in one-time state funds
  - July 1, 2021 – August 31, 2022
  - Requires board approval by June 1 (on 5/25 board meeting agenda)
- At least 85% of funds must be used to provide in-person services
- At least 10% of funds must be spent on paraprofessionals to support specialized student groups
- Eligible services and supports include:
  - Supplemental instruction
  - Support for social-emotional well-being
- Target student populations include:
  - Low-income
  - English learners
  - Foster youth
  - Experiencing homelessness
  - Exceptional needs
  - At-risk of abuse, neglect or exploitation
  - Disengaged
  - Below grade level

# Expanded Learning Opportunity Grant Overview

The Expanded Learning Opportunity Grant describes how:

- parents, teachers, and school staff were involved in the development of the plan
- students will be identified and the needs of students will be assessed
- parents and guardians of students will be informed of the opportunities for supplemental instruction and support
- the LEA's plan provides supplemental instruction and support
- ELO Grant funds are being coordinated with other federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Funds received by the LEA

- The online application to collect input remained open from May 5 - May 20

# Supplemental Instruction and Support Strategies



1. Extending instructional learning time
2. Accelerating progress to close learning gaps
  - a. Tutoring or other one-on-one or small group learning
  - b. Learning recovery programs and materials
  - c. Educator training, for both certificated and classified staff
3. Integrated student supports to address other barriers to learning
4. Community hubs that provide technology, high-speed internet, and other academic support
5. Credit recovery
6. Diagnostic, progress monitoring, and benchmark assessments
7. Training on social-emotional strategies

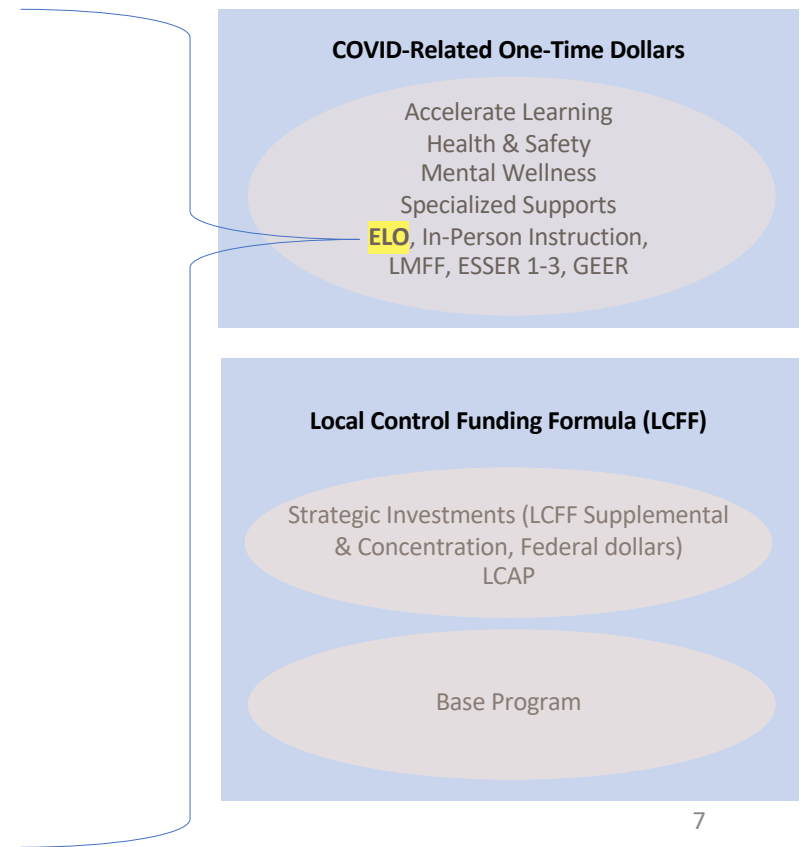

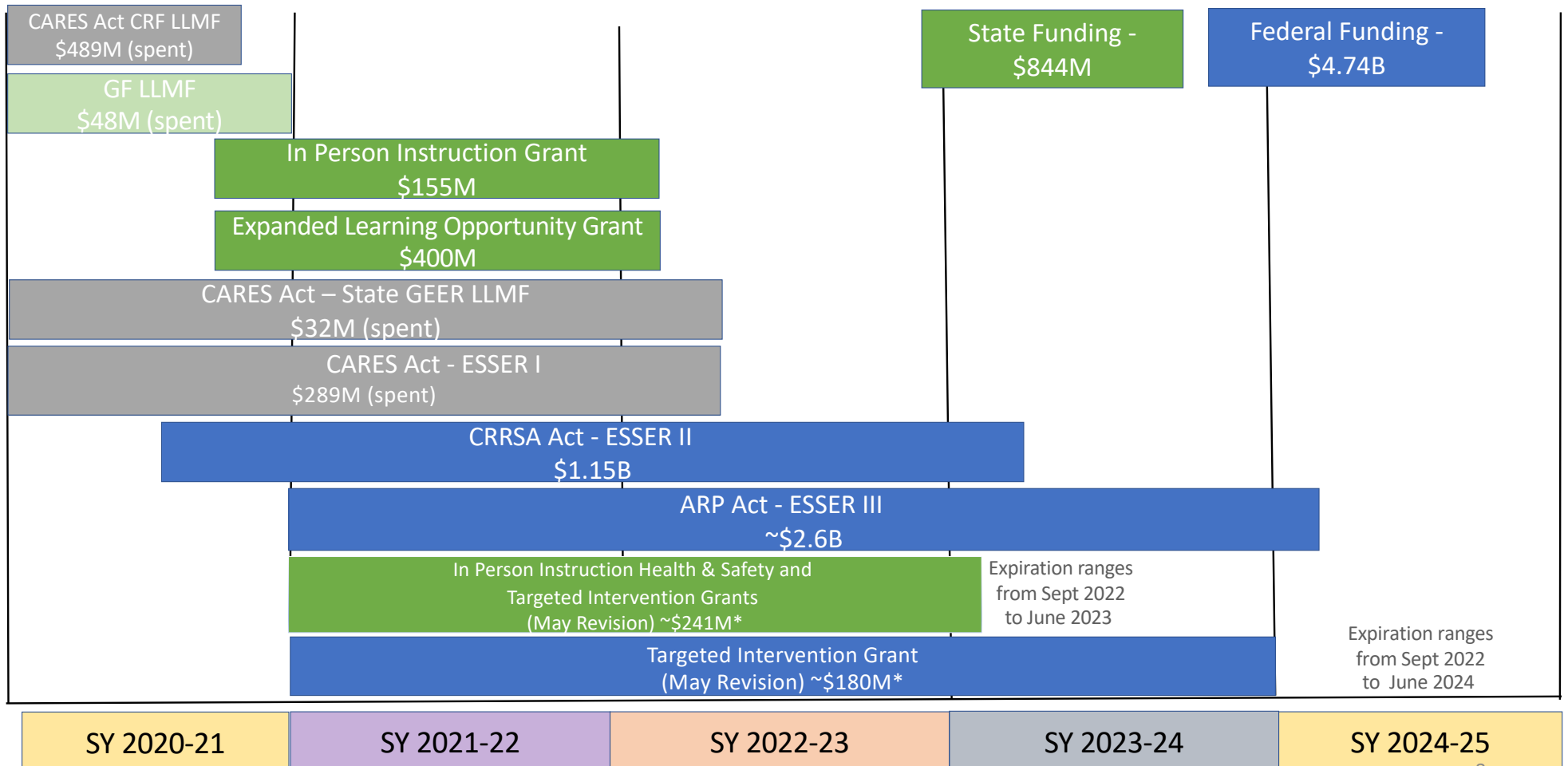

- Accelerating Progress to Close Learning Gaps
  - Tutoring & Small Group Instruction - \$54M
  - Primary Promise - \$140.3M
    - Teachers (English & Math) - \$80M
    - Instructional Aides (English & Math) - \$39.3M
    - Other Supports - \$21M
  - School Site Family Engagement - \$18M
    - Parent & Community Services Branch
    - COS Engagement, Teacher Differentials, Technology
- Supports for Credit Deficient Students
  - Credit Recovery - \$18M
  - Assistance with Financial Aid - \$7M
- Additional Academic Services for Students
  - Software Content for Digital Development - \$43.5M
