Providing Safety Net



- 60 million+ meals served to children and adults
- \$23 million+ raised to support the effort
- More than 7 million educational, recreational and baby-related items provided to families

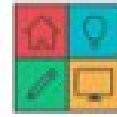

Enhancing Learning at Home

- Expanded summer school for all students
- Partnerships for engaging summer learning
- Library cards available to all students
- One-to-one instruction for students who need help



ILLUMINATION



Mastering Online Learning

- 35,000+ educators received 10 hours of training
- 14,000+ educators participated in 30 hour Future-Ready Certification
- Began 2020-2021 school year with more rigorous school schedules
- 96%+ students connected to learn at home
- 88%+ student attendance



New Standard in Education

- Nation-leading virus testing and contact tracing program
- App development for tracking
- Investing in PPE and facilities improvements that meet health and safety best practices



Supervision of Children

- Initial planning began in May
- Phase 1 supervision of children of employees at school sites
- Phase 2 preparing for supervision of students – date to be determined



Leading the Nation

- Greater transparency and sharing of distance learning information (e.g., student engagement)
- Bridged the digital divide faster than other districts, including devices and hotspots
- Matched or exceeded most other districts' 1st week attendance
- One of only three other large urban districts providing meals to all community members
- Many East Coast districts began school after Labor Day
