Contract Value

\$7.2M

Transporting Youth in Foster Care to Their Original School

- Seeking approval for a five year contract not to exceed \$7.2 million, with matching funds from the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS).
- A partnership with DCFS, the Los Angeles County Department of Education (LACOE), and the Los Angeles County Department of Workforce Development, Aging and Community Services (WDACS).
- Provides transportation for students in out of home foster care to continue attending their school of origin. This stability enables youth to continue their education without disruption, maintain established relationships with peers and adults, and better prepare for college, careers and life.
- Supports the 7,000+ preschool to 12th grade students who are entering foster care, placed in out-of-home care, and/or are changing placements under the supervision of DCFS.



Nurse Home Visitation Program for Students who are First-time Mothers

\$4.0M

- Seeking approval for a \$4.0 million federally-funded grant to continue the Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) program in collaboration with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.
- Specially trained nurses provide regular home visits to students who are first-time mothers-to-be, including students from vulnerable populations such as low income, English learners, youth in foster care, and students with special needs.
- Students are supported throughout their pregnancy and until their baby is two-years old, with a majority of program participants graduating from high school and pursuing higher education. The program positively impacts:
 - Prenatal health
 - Student absenteeism
 - Children’s health, development and school readiness
 - Economic self-sufficiency for the mother

Preparing Students for College and Careers

- Seeking approval of \$95,000 contract to provide after-school standards-based science, technology, engineering, arts and math (STEAM) programs to students in grades 2-5 at Thomas Bradley Global Awareness Magnet.
- Seeking approval of \$221,760 contract, funded by parent donations, to provide Mandarin Chinese tutors for the Mandarin dual language education programs at Broadway and Braddock Drive Elementary Schools. Thank you parents!



Investing in Professional Development

- Seeking approval of \$95,000 contract to support Vista Middle School math teachers with improving teaching practices in order to continue increasing student achievement, engagement and confidence in math courses.

- Seeking approval of \$60,000 contract to support teachers at Augustus Hawkins Critical Design and Gaming School (CDAGS) with facilitating hands-on makerspace workshops where students create projects that are engaging, rigorous, and intended to increase learning opportunities in science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM).

New Projects

Three new Sustainable Environment Enhancements Developments for Schools (SEEDS) Projects

- Established in 2013, the SEEDS program enhances sites by creating outdoor learning spaces in collaboration with school and community led efforts.
- Seeking approval for \$100K SEEDS projects at: Harbor City Elementary School, Holmes Middle School and White Middle School.

Critical School Repairs

- Seeking approval of \$900K for 45,000 square feet of new roofing [on 16 buildings] at Kenter Canyon Canyon Charter Elementary School.



- Seeking approval of \$1.2M for water damage repairs and 20,000 square feet of new roofing [on 8 buildings] at Los Angeles Center for Enriched Students (LACES).

Contract Actions

92nd Street Elementary School (BD7, LD South)

- Comprehensive Modernization Project will provide safe and updated school facilities to support 21st century learning.
- ~\$77M investment anticipated – Seeking adoption of Negative Declaration and contract approval.
- New facilities to be constructed include 17 classrooms, instructional support spaces, and covered walkways.
- Assembly/Classroom Building will be modernized, including seismic upgrades to make it more earthquake safe, a new roof, and new HVAC systems.
- More than 1,400 jobs anticipated to be generated.
